Faulkner's Island Exhibit Remains Open Through 2004

To the millions of people who envision drama, romance, and tragedy when they see a lighthouse, Faulkner's Island is no disappointment. For 201 years she has been to Long Island Sound what Lady Liberty is to New York Harbor—a revered landmark and welcoming beacon to mariners and mainlanders alike. As a protected wildlife refuge owned by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, the island is open to the public only on a very limited basis. The exhibit at the Henry Whitfield State Museum in Guilford, CT is your opportunity to get a close and refreshing look at this monument to the American nautical soul.

Thanks to the Connecticut Commission on Arts, Tourism, Culture, History and Film, the new state agency that operates the museum, the exhibit "Bicentennial Beacon: Faulkner's Island Lighthouse, 1801-2002" will remain open through 2004. The first interpretive center devoted to the refuge and light station, it is a collaborative effort by the museum, Faulkner's Light Brigade, and the Stewart B. McKinney National Wildlife Refuge. Museum Curator Michael A. McBride's early vision of the exhibit resulted in a planning meeting with John Kirby, Fred Farnsworth, and Joel Helander in 2001. The exhibit premiered in time for the Bicentennial celebration of the lighthouse in September, 2002.

Although implemented on a shoestring budget, the exhibit has all the qualities of a first-class museum exhibition

thanks to its major benefactors: Mr. Guido Petra of Petra Construction Corp. who supplied labor and materials for the display, and Joel Helander who lent photographs and artifacts from his personal collection. Mr. McBride and Assistant Curator Michelle Parrish have ingeniously redecorated two rooms with a maritime theme that recalls a Victorian lightkeeper's dwelling, replete with a Franklin stove. They have also organized the exhibit on a timeline based on Helander's book on island history. Visitors travel through time to witness early Native American use of the island, its farming by colonial residents, its purchase by the U.S. Government, and the lighthouse's construction. The colorful lives of the lightkeepers and their families are recounted, as is the devastating fire of 1976, the transfer of island jurisdiction from the U.S. Coast Guard to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, and Dr. Jeffrey Spendelow's dedicated tern project.

The centerpiece for the exhibit is decidedly the 4th order Fresnel lens on loan from the U.S. Coast Guard's Office of Aids to Navigation in Boston. The lens was manufactured in France and is identical to the one used as a beacon at Faulkner's. It accompanies an original GE 1000 watt bulb, the last source of illumination before the fire of '76, which dwarfs the 9.25 watt bulb and replica plastic lens used on the island today (see p. 2). One of the curious Leslie-Tyfon trumpet





foghorns introduced to Faulkner's after 1934 is also on display.

If you have ever wondered what the tern scientists do on Faulkner's Island but have never attended the annual Open House (see p. 5), this is your opportunity to find out. One section of the exhibit is devoted to the "Falkner Island Tern Project." Another spotlights the island's erosion emergency, the pioneering survey work of George Gdovin and Little Harbor Laboratory, and the U.S. Army Corps' of Engineers' erosion control project. Phase One of the project was completed in the year 2001, incorporating a

stone revetment to break waves and support the embankment. This massive bulwark is nearly 20 feet high and 50 feet wide at the base. The upper embankment or bluff on the eastern side of the island has been re-contoured to a gentler 45 degree slope and revegetated.

The Bicentennial Beacon Exhibit has received national coverage in *Lighthouse Digest* and has helped to raise museum attendance to 20,000

per year. With an activity workshop area specifically designed for children, the exhibit is geared to persons of all ages. A television monitor also features a WTNH videotape of the sights and sounds of beautiful Faulkner's. If you would like to experience this romantic island in a way that will stir your senses, visit the



National Lighthouse Museum Underway

The National Lighthouse Museum taking shape on Staten Island, NY occupies the original site of the US Lighthouse Service Depot. Years of investigations into

the wretched conditions of American lighthouses led in 1852 to the creation of the Lighthouse Board which mandated that drastic reforms be undertaken in the training of keepers, the soundness of lighthouse construction and placement, and the quality of equipment. Supply depots were scattered across the country in 12 lighthouse districts, but a central facility

was needed. In 1863 the wartime Lincoln Administration authorized use of the former site at St. George on Staten Island of the Revenue Cutter Service, the oldest armed maritime service in the US. This became the "Super Depot," from which the US Lighthouse Service could test and fabricate equipment, and supply all U.S. light stations.


By the 1930s most lighthouses had been electrified, which eliminated many of the lightkeepers' duties. Wicks no longer needed constant tending, glass chimneys, lenses, and lantern windows no longer needed to be wiped free of soot all night. The clock mechanisms driving the revolving lenses no longer had to be wound. Gradually, three-keeper stations dwindled to two, and then one-keeper stations.

The Coast Guard took over the duties of the Lighthouse Service in 1939. As keepers, lampists, and metal smiths retired, much of the expertise of the service was lost, and lighthouse support became a low-priority mission. When the Coast Guard acquired Governors Island off the tip of Manhattan in 1968, it abandoned the old depot on Staten Island. By the 1980s a dozen of its buildings had been razed to make way for a ferry maintenance facility, and the rest fell into disrepair. Fearful of more demolition, residents and elected officials clamored to preserve this historic site in the 1990s.

Many of the surviving structures are now on the National Register of Historic Places and eligible for government support. In 1998 a site selection committee chose the old depot as the future home of the National Lighthouse Museum. It lies directly adjacent to the Staten Island Ferry Terminal with panoramic views of New York harbor. A pier will be home berth for museum vessels like the Lightship Nantucket-112, and for tour boats. With over two million





tourists riding the ferry every year, the museum promises to become a major visitor center in the city.

William Kolodnicki, Manager of the Stewart B. McKinney National Wildlife Refuge will speak at the Guilford


Community Center. The McKinney Refuge consists of Faulkner's Island


